This is the biggest event Neighborhood Council event of the year, and along with many City electeds and department representatives, the Congress of Neighborhoods has also confirmed keynote speaker, Supervisor Mark Ridley Thomas. Many thanks to the Congress of Neighborhoods Planning Committee, chaired by the awesome Cindy Cleghorn, for their amazing efforts, and to our staff for their support, especially Neighborhood Empowerment Advocates, Jasmine Duckworth and Mary Kim! This month, we are also welcoming our two new members of the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners, North Valley Commissioner, Shooshig Susan Avakian, and the Harbor Commissioner, Raymond Regalado. #### Citywide Campaign:

The CAO has released for the Neighborhood Councils' review the 2017-18 <u>Appropriation Limit Report</u> for the Gann Initiative, which limits the amount of revenue which can be appropriated in any fiscal year. The Council File associated with this report is for the budget <u>CF 17-0600</u> and, per Section 7910 of the Government Code, is provided to the public for review at least 15 days before adopting the appropriations limit.

#### Administrative Update:

The Health, Education and Neighborhood Councils Committee adopted a motion to move the 2018 elections to 2019 while providing instructions to the City Clerk and EmpowerLA on election outreach and online voting/registration build out the next year. HENC Chair Councilmember David Ryu wanted to ensure that those Neighborhood Council that still desired to hold an election in 2018 would have another option of selection instead, which is a nonsecret vote either through caucus or signed/numbered ballots. If your Neighborhood Council wants to hold a selection in 2018 in lieu of an election, then please complete the Selection Process Stipulation Worksheet and return it to elections@empowerla.org by November 1, 2017 so that we can prepare for a selection for your Neighborhood Council next year. We're highlighting the Neighborhood Council diversity gathering information on the gender, age range and ethnicities of board members this month. Please take a moment to help us by taking this short survey, which will be open through September 30th. We will only be using the information as a whole, i.e. there are 43% women in the Neighborhood Council system, and individual information will be confidential. Our staff will have the survey available during this month's Neighborhood Council meetings. The survey is voluntary. For members who don't take the survey, we'll provide visual estimates of the information with a file note that we did so.



#### **Funding Updates:**

The Office of the City Clerk, Neighborhood Council Funding Program would like to congratulate the Neighborhood Councils for the many ways in which they empower their communities. Thanks to the online funding system, we know that system-wide, outreach and general operations expenditures are priority for NCs accounting for 75.8% of spent and committed funds. We also know that you value your partnerships with non-profit organizations and public schools because Neighborhood Purposes Grants (NPGs) account for 18.7% of your financial activity.

You can find all this information and more by visiting the <u>Neighborhood Council Funding System dashboard</u>, which is accessible to anyone thereby making the financial operations of any neighborhood council transparent to the public. There is also an ability to look up information by individual NC on account balances and transactions in real time, which you can do on your desk top or via your mobile device.

NCs seem to also meet the challenge of completing their Monthly Expenditure Reports (MERs) with great ease in the new system. For those who have not seen how the system works yet, the Office of the City Clerk will be holding a session at Congress on Saturday 9/9/17 so please join us.

## Field Updates:

September rings back to school for many and the Leadership Academy is committed to supporting our Neighborhood Councils and cadre of life-long learners.

To find out which census tracts makes up your Neighborhood Council boundaries, you can utilize the Bureau of Engineering's NavigateLA website. Here's a <u>step-by-step guide</u> on how to access the information.

Combing through Census Data can be insightful and may reveal some interesting characteristics about your community. For example, you can find out what are the modes of transportation your residents take to go to work and their commute time, which may help shape your Neighborhood Council's transportation policy. You can find out which areas in your neighborhood have a higher concentration of limited English speakers and formulate an outreach campaign in a different language.

Finally, here's a step-by-step guide on How to Utilize Zimas for Mailers. Many thanks to our partners at the Department of City Planning (DCP) for the wealth of information presented at last month's Planning 101s held Citywide. DCP's Zimas is a powerful tool to help analyze the zoning and land-use in your neighborhood. It can also be utilized to download addresses into an Excel document to then be mail-merged. Coupled with the insight you now have with Census Data, you can push out a targeted mailer campaign.

Raphael Sonenshein, Executive Director of the Pat Brown Insitute, Cal State Los Angeles, and Neighborhood Council Civic University professor, credits the Neighborhood Council system for "saving Los Angeles" in the 1990's when various parts of the City wanted to secede because they felt City Hall was not representing their communities. Neighborhood Councils were proposed as a way to bring local voices to City Hall and were voted into the City Charter by Angelenos in 1999.
