Thank you to all the Neighborhood Council board members who completed the demographics survey in September! We are in the process of compiling the results and will release them later on this month. We are happy to welcome our FUSE Corp Fellow, Aparna Mukherjee, today. Aparna will spend the next year with us to assist in the creation of an Office of Civic Engagement, which will work with City departments to use effective civic engagement models to connect with Neighborhood Councils and other community stakeholders. Aparna is relocating from New York City and is a product strategist and operations leader with experience helming digital and mobile projects for some of the world's biggest media outlets. At The New York Times, she ran the paper's education ventures group. Aparna's other innovation-focused roles include launching social media for McKinsey & Co., serving as director of operations for startup accelerator Grand Central Tech, and launching Morgan Stanley's alumni network. As a reporter, she has written for the Wall Street Journal, Associated Press, Bloomberg News, and The New Yorker. Aparna earned a BS from Bryn Mawr College, where she was a Luce Scholar, and a master's in journalism and an MBA from Columbia University, where she lectures on business strategy to MBAs. Citywide Campaign:

City Council has continued the recommendations of the <u>Health, Education and Neighborhood Councils Committee</u> regarding Neighborhood Council election timing and online voting to October 6, 2018. If your Neighborhood Council is interested in conducting a selection instead of an election, please make sure to complete and vote on the <u>Neighborhood Council Selection Procedures Worksheet</u>. The due date is November 1, 2017.

Administrative Update:

The recent string of fraud emails are being investigated by the City and have involved several enforcement agencies. Fortunately, no funds have been paid to any fraudulent vendors from any of the Neighborhood Councils to date, but we will need to keep monitoring for now. The Department is continuing to collect opinions on our current web page, what you like, what you don't like, and whether you can find the choices you're looking for while navigating the site. Please take a moment to complete our survey so we can make our website a more effective and useful resource for you.



Funding Updates:

Many thanks to all the NC Treasurers and card holders that have attended our NC Funding and System Trainings. As of now, we have trained a total of 95 NCs, needing only 2 more NCs for 100% compliance! We have issued a total of 86 Credit Cards and have conducted over 15 trainings on Funding and the online System. We continue to hear good feedback on the system as well as your opinions on needed tweaks. We have gotten some questions about training on NC Funding that is geared for regular board members. It is our goal to have a new training tool available on our website within the month of October. We have taken our current training that we do for Treasurers and card holders, and condensed it into a 30 minute narrated powerpoint presentation, which covers key points and critical information for board members to know. The presentation will culminate with an online quiz to ensure that you have a good foundation on the rules and guidelines for expenditures of public funds. We will be holding 3 Funding and System training sessions in October; two located in downtown and one out in the field. We will announce the date and location for the field training shortly. Special Note: Please remember that when submitting payment requests and uploading documents, we need you to redact any sensitive, identifiable information such as social security numbers. The system will not request that information and if we see it on your documents, we will most likely reject the request and let you know that sensitive information has been identified and needs to be redacted. Field Updates:

As the weather starts to cool, it's the perfect time to start planning ahead for community improvement projects (CIP) in your neighborhood. Here are 5 helpful tips for your Neighborhood Council. 1. Refer to your Strategic Plan to help identify the project and/or location for your CIP. 2. Research and apply for all the necessary permits, particularly for work being conducted in the public right-of-way. Mayor Eric Garcetti's Great Street DYI Manual is a "Great" resource for Neighborhood Councils, with a step-by-step guide to over 50 projects, and how to pull the necessary City permits. 3. Contact your Neighborhood Council Advocate to see how EmpowerLA can assist and help troubleshoot. 4. Flush out the details, finalize the budget and vet the CIP through your NC Committee/Board process. Don't forget to submit all the necessary paperwork to the City Clerk's Funding Team. 5.
